FARMS Advanced career day at Fresno Madera Farm Credit was a big hit

If the FARMS Advanced group that participated in a career day at Fresno Madera Farm Credit is indicative of the quality of high school students in the program, the future of California agriculture is in good hands.

That's the view of Katie Burchfield, Fresno Madera's marketing manager, who helped put the event together last fall with Mindy Clisso, the Central Valley FARMS Leadership coordinator.

"The students were really engaged and had a ton of questions about working in lending and what kind of degrees they would need to get to that level," Burchfield said. "Because of all their questions, the career day presentations went longer than expected. It was great to see the next generation of aggies interested in learning about all the facets of agriculture."

Nine students from the greater Fresno/Visalia area attended the day-long event, arranged to give the students a chance to interact with an organization important to agriculture – and to hold it indoors instead of in the field on a wet, cold day.

Burchfield said the visit clearly had an impact on at least one of the students. She said FARMS Alumni and Internship Manager Leticia Hernandez recently sent her an email that said student Lisa Chareunsouk applied for a \$500 My Job Depends on Ag scholarship to attend UC Berkeley in the fall and said Farm Credit was her new career goal.

"My future academic goal is to pursue higher education by attending a 4-year university to obtain a bachelor's degree in economics," Chareunsouk wrote. "As for my career goal, I want to become a credit loan officer at a farm credit union to provide loans to farmers in need of funds because I believe supporting farmers financially is an important component in agriculture."

Hernandez added that the FARMS program was thankful for its partnership with Farm Credit and its continued support.
